Dear Parents and Guardians,

As of Wednesday, February 10, the Ministry of Education requires that **all secondary students complete a daily COVID-19 screening** before or on arrival at school, as well as **provide confirmation to the school** they have completed this screening with results indicating they are permitted to attend school.

We ask that prior to leaving for school each day, Grade 9-12 students complete the [UCDSB Student COVID-19 Self-Screening Tool](#). We are asking students to use this tool in place of the Ontario COVID-19 tool they may already be using.

The [UCDSB Student COVID-19 Self-Screening Tool](#) can be completed using any device, including a smartphone. Students simply need to click the link, log in with their **UCDSB email credentials** and complete the form. When students complete the screening, the school will be automatically notified.

**Students who do not have access to a device or internet connectivity will be asked to sign in at the school and confirm on paper that they have done the self-screening.**

Attached is the poster that will be available for students at school to do self-screening if they have not done it prior to arrival.

Each day, **school staff will be following up with students who did not complete the daily screening.**

The [UCDSB Student COVID-19 Self-Screening Tool](#) is available now and we encourage students to start using this right away. **It will be mandatory as of Wednesday, February 10.**

Ensuring the health and safety of our students and staff is a priority. We all play an important role in keeping everyone safe and limiting the spread of COVID-19 in our communities.
